LIFE LINE AMBULANCE OPENS NEW STATION TODAY IN SPRING VALLEY

PRESCOTT, Ariz. – Life Line Ambulance Service, a private ambulance company serving Northern Arizona, has recently opened a substation in Spring Valley, Ariz., near Mayer, Ariz.; this is the company's ninth substation in the service area. Substation 71, located at 17210 E Road Runner Road, became operational 24 hours a day, seven days a week Feb. 27 at 7:30 a.m.

The new site is staffed by crews composed of Advanced Life Support and Emergency Medical Technician-Basic personnel, according to Glenn Kasprzyk, chief operating officer for Life Line.

“We will be working very closely with Mayer Fire District to supplement emergency services to the area with quicker response times,” Kasprzyk said. “Current and future staffing at this Spring Valley substation will assist Mayer Fire Department in keeping fire fighters in the district for fire and EMS calls, which, in turn, will reduce its financial burden.”

Life Line Ambulance is the largest ground ambulance service in northern Arizona. Established in 1956, the company services more than 8,500 square miles in Yavapai County, Coconino County and in the northwest corner of Maricopa County. This area covers both populated and rural areas from strategically placed stations. Life Line currently has nine stations and employs a staff of approximately 200, including paramedics, intermediate and basic emergency medical technicians and registered nurses, along with a support staff of professional dispatch, customer service, human resource, accounting and fleet maintenance personnel.
