WICKENBURG COMMUNITY HOSPITAL PRESENTS 'COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD' FOR 2007 TO LIFE LINE AMBULANCE

PRESCOTT, Ariz. – Life Line Ambulance, the largest private ambulance service in northern Arizona, has recently been recognized by Wickenburg Community Hospital with its “Community Service Award” for 2007, which recognizes Life Line’s contribution to the betterment of the health of the Wickenburg community.

The hospital hosted an awards dinner Feb. 5, where Dale Decker, chief executive officer for the hospital, presented the award to Life Line. Glenn Kasprzyk, chief operations officer for Life Line, accepted the award on the company’s behalf.

The company provides 24/7 advanced life support services from its station at 1155 Tegner in Wickenburg and from its station located 41026 N. Castle Hot Springs Road in Morristown. Life Line also provides cardio pulmonary resuscitation classes for health care providers and for the general public from its Wickenburg station.

The hospital has awarded “Community Service” honors five times previously. This was the first time Life Line was recognized with this award.

Life Line Ambulance is the largest ground ambulance service in northern Arizona. Established in 1956, the company services more than 9,000 square miles in Yavapai County, Coconino County and in the northwest corner of Maricopa County. This area covers both populated and rural areas. Life Line currently has 11 strategically placed stations and employs a staff of approximately 225, including paramedics, intermediate and basic emergency medical technicians and registered nurses, along with a support staff of professional dispatch, customer service, human resource, accounting and fleet maintenance personnel.
