LIFE LINE AMBULANCE DONATES FIRST-AID SUPPLIES TO PRESCOTT VALLEY LITTLE LEAGUE

PRESCOTT, Ariz. - Life Line Ambulance, the largest private ambulance company serving Northern Arizona, has recently donated first-aid supplies, such as bandages, antiseptic towelettes and gloves, to the Prescott Valley Little League. These supplies refill the nearly 100 first-aid boxes the company originally donated four years ago.

“Little League is a nonprofit organization,” said Don Huntley, safety officer for the league, as well as head coach for a minors team, the Red Sox, and assistant coach for a majors team, the Mets. “Anything we can get donated means we can put more money into operating the team. We are very grateful for Life Line’s donations of first-aid supplies and kits over the past several years. We make very good use of them right away.”

“We are members of the communities we serve, including Prescott Valley,” said Glenn Kasprzyk, Life Line Ambulance’s chief operations officer. “As good citizens, we try to provide what we can to keep our kids safe. These are just small items, but they help the team keep playing healthy.”

Life Line crew members Jeremy Thompson, EMT, and Margaret Stults, I-EMT, helped Huntley and other board members pack the kits.

Life Line Ambulance is the largest ground ambulance service in northern Arizona. Established in 1956, the company services more than 9,000 square miles in Yavapai County, Coconino County and in the northwest corner of Maricopa County. This area covers both populated and rural areas. Life Line currently has nine strategically place stations and employs a staff of approximately 225, including paramedics, intermediate and basic emergency medical technicians and registered nurses, along with a support staff of professional dispatch, customer service, human resource, accounting and fleet maintenance personnel.
